Janelle will continue to serve in an advisory role to NBCF.

Kevin Hail has been with the foundation for over 20 years and has made a significant impact in leading the foundation forward in financial growth and stewardship, strategic planning, cause marketing, and technology innovation.

Rebecca Buell has been with NBCF for over 14 years and has helped strengthen the organization’s financial foundation while leading operational functions to enhance efficiency and build scalable infrastructure that supports long-term mission growth.

Douglas Feil is a mission-driven leader with over 20 years in the non-profit sector, including 16 years at NBCF. As Chief Program Officer for the past seven years, he has helped launch and expand life-saving early detection, treatment, and support programs for breast cancer patients worldwide.

National Mammography Program

NBCF has partnered with medical facilities* in underserved communities across the U.S. by providing free breast cancer screening and diagnostic services. In 2025, NBCF partnered with 69 hospitals and provided 25,817 services.

There is currently no known cure for breast cancer, and its early diagnosis is critical to survival. When breast cancer is found in the earliest, localized stage, the 5-year relative survival rate is over 99%.

Breast Health Education

In 2025, NBCF empowered women nationwide through comprehensive breast health education and awareness initiatives supported by 10,590 volunteers.

NBCF presented 32 Breast Cancer Awareness in the Workplace sessions to 3,113 participants, helping organizations promote early detection and support employees impacted by breast cancer.

Through breast health education services, personalized navigation support was provided to 906 individuals via phone and email. This included screening resources, financial assistance, emotional support, breast cancer information and more.

In total, NBCF distributed educational and awareness materials to 129,391 people, equipping them with knowledge and resources to take charge of their breast health.



Metastatic Breast Cancer Retreats

In 2025, NBCF funded 17 retreats for 229 patients and caregivers in attendance.

Metastatic breast cancer retreats are a powerful way for NBCF to support women with Stage 4 metastatic breast cancer. Retreats focus on the metastatic diagnosis and prognosis, sharing of available resources, and emotional support of patients and caregivers so they can focus on fully enjoying life and time with their loved ones.

HOPE Kits™

We distributed 27,770 HOPE Kits, and an additional 174 Metastatic Kits, to patients undergoing breast cancer treatment in 2025. NBCF hosted 113 packing parties with and for local volunteers.

The HOPE Kit is a tangible expression of hope to provide support to women currently undergoing breast cancer treatment. These kits are filled with thoughtful items which are known to soothe some of the side effects from treatment.

Community Outreach

In 2025, 19,631 individuals were served at 155 outreach events in partnership with community organizations and ambassadors. Through the Community Ambassador program, 98 ambassadors were trained.

NBCF’s Community Ambassador program trains and equips community leaders to share breast health information and promote NBCF’s screening and navigation programs to those in need.



Support Groups

In 2025, NBCF hosted 49 monthly support groups attended by women across the country, with a total of 290 participants.

NBCF hosts monthly support groups where our group facilitator works with cancer survivors during "caring & sharing" time to encourage healthy dialogue and education for everyone involved. Having the support of others is an important part of breast cancer survivorship. Research shows that taking part in support groups, where you both give and receive help, is an effective way to reduce the stress and anxiety that can come with a breast cancer diagnosis.

Patient Relief Program

NBCF partnered with 27 hospitals, served 1,457 women, and provided 1,991 services in 2025.

NBCF's Patient Relief Program helps remove non-medical barriers to care by providing financial assistance to underserved women through our national network of partner hospitals and clinics.

All partner facilities are carefully selected and certified to ensure funds directly benefit patients in need. Grantees submit outcome reports twice a year, detailing how funds are used, the number of women served, and the services provided.

Military Patient Relief Fund

In 2025, NBCF provided funds to 107 military veterans and service members facing financial struggles during their breast cancer battle.

The Military Patient Relief Fund aids military veterans and service members in overcoming financial strains stemming from a breast cancer diagnosis. These funds ease challenging expenses such as transportation, access to food, childcare, medical copays, housing and utility expenses, and other financial hardships.



Hope Innovation Lab

The Hope Innovation Lab is NBCF's collaborative space dedicated to developing innovative solutions that meet the evolving needs of women affected by breast cancer. Through pilot programs, strategic partnerships, and data-driven insights, the Lab tests and refines new approaches to patient support, education, and early detection.

In FY2025, NBCF collaborated with 10 partner hospitals through the Hope Innovation Lab to pilot initiatives that expand access to care and enhance the breast cancer experience for underserved women.

Each project is designed to strengthen NBCF's mission and ensure every woman has access to the care, resources, and hope she deserves, no matter where she is on her breast cancer journey.






